

# EXHIBIT G

SFPD INTERVIEW OF DAVID GURVITZ

January 28, 1993

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The following is a transcript of an interview of DAVID GURVITZ (DG), which was conducted on January 28, 1993 by Sergeants RON ROTH (RR) and ROBERT HULSEY (RH) of the San Francisco, California, Police Department. Also present was attorney ALEXANDER RIBAKOFF (AR) representing GURVITZ.

RR: Okay, the date is 1/28/93. The time is 11:18 a.m. Right now we're in Orange, California at the law, law offices of ALEX RIBAKOFF. Uh, present is Mr. RIBAKOFF and his client DAVID GURVITZ. I am Sergeant RON ROTH from the San Francisco Police Department, and with me is Sergeant ROBERT HULSEY, also of the San Francisco Police Department. Uh, Mr. GURVITZ has graciously, uh, consented to an interview of him, and we have assured Mr. GURVITZ that he is not the focus of our investigation at this time, uh, and any statement he makes, uh, which is being tape recorded, uh, will not be used against you in any criminal proceeding brought by the San Francisco Police Department or the San Francisco District Attorney's Office. Copies of this tape will be provided to Mr. RIBAKOFF, uh, for his review, uh, after. Anything I left out there?

AR: Ah, no.

RR: Okay.

AR: Go right ahead.

RR: All right. DAVID, what I'd like to, uh, I think you pretty much have a sense of, uh, by reading the newspaper, what this, uh, investigation is focusing on, and I'd like to ask you some questions about your relationship with the ADL and with CAL BULLOCK and, uh, some offshoots of, of, those things, if it's all right. Uh, first of all I'd like to talk about the, uh, Anti-Defamation League. When did you first start working for them?

DG: I started working for the Anti-Defamation League in March of 1989. The end of March.

RR: And when....

DG: Around the twenty-fifth, or something.

RR: When did you finish with them?

DG: October 9, 1992.

RR: And what was your, uh, job in those, uh, three, three and a half years, or so?

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DG: My position was called Fact Finding Librarian. Uh, my job was basically to, uh, maintain the file room, and to monitor the, the activities of extremist groups, on the West Coast.

RR: Particularly in Southern California or the Whole West Coast?

DG: Particularly in Southern California, although the Los Angeles office is kind of like the hub for the West Coast, uh, we get copies of all the memos from Denver, Phoenix, San Francisco, Seattle, but most particularly, Southern California.

RR: Okay. By "monitor extremist groups," what did that entail?

DG: That entailed, uh, we had, um, a private mail drop, uh, we received, uh, uh, literature of a lot of the extremist groups. Uh, on occasion, going to meetings, um...

RR: Is that an undercover-type capacity?

DG: Yeah. Um, monitoring the various, uh, "hate lines," is it, of groups. That sort of thing.

RR: Now this was your, part of your function for the entire three and a half years?

DG: Yes.

RR: Okay. Did anybody else in your office assist you in this function?

DG: Well, I, uh, my supervisor, my first supervisor was BETSY ROSENTHAL, the predecessor of TZVIA SCHWARTZ. Then TZVIA SCHWARTZ, but, basically I was on my own. Uh, it, I, I did the job on my own. Uh, on occasion, you know, they would tell me, uh, cover such-and-such a meeting, uh...

RR: Who, who's "they?"

DG: Uh, TZVIA.

RR: Okay, um....

DG: On occasion DAVID LEHRER, but he really wasn't that much
