On reading and re-reading the 19 addresses which make up this collection, it is striking, especially in retrospect, to note how clearly they reveal the qualities and talenta which made Dr. Silver the leader of the hour of the Zionist Movement. Our period of world conflict produced remarkable, types of orator statesmen. men like Receivelt and Churchill, who were not only able to present the issues of struggle to their peoples in clear and clarion language, but to mobilise and to lead them surely and swiftly to victorious conclusions. bravery, but that in the midst of
a war he did not hesitate to castigate the policies of our own
government.

Political Rights First

An analysis of the content of these addresses will produce a lucid outline of the principles and methods upon the basis of which was waged the American Zionist campaign, which proved to be the greatest single factor in enlisting first American and then United Nations support for the establishment of a Jewish State. These can be reduced to a few simple and inexorably logical principles which, looking backward as we now can with the help of these speeches, seem always to have, been clearly envisaged in the mind of the speaker. He understood that a clear recognition of

Jewish political rights and aspirations had to precede immigration demands, that without such clarification, neither the British nor the Arabs would be cajoled or fooled into yielding substantial immigration increases. On this question Dr. Silver was very much in the minority against those who believed that the fight should be waged against the White Paper instead of for the Jewish Commonwealth. This opposition both within and without the Zionist Movement had to be overcome. It was a long, bitter . effort leaving in its wake personal animonities, but it was crucial to the final outcome.

Because he was convinced that without the Jewish State there would be little or no immigration into Palestine, Dr. Silver took his stand foursquare on the platform of classic political Zionism and made of it a militant program, with whose basic concepts there could be no compromise. He thus became the foremost spokesman of our age for Herzlian Zionism against Achad Ha Am-ism and other deviations. Sections of these speeches are incomparable expositions of political Zionism, par-

ticularly those passages which draw the cogent distinctions between refugeeism and Zionism. Finally, he was convinced that garnering American support was the sine qua non of victory and that an appeal to American postwar interest in the Near East could and would be successful. This was the goal toward which he set the compass of his strategy.

Out in the Open

In the area of strategy and tactics, Dr. Silver followed undevistingly his conviction, so well phrased by Emanuel Neumann in his superb foreword to this volume, that a straight line is the shortest distance between two points. He first aimed to break the bottleneck of official silence. moving the Palestine question into the arena of public discussion by the introduction of a resolution into Congress. Then he utilized to the full the democratic method of mass education and organization in order to create that favorable climate of public opinion of which officials and legislators would soon become aware. He maisted upon adhering

atrictly to the non-partiann rule of enlisting bi-partiann support instead of leaning for support upon one party or one leader. It is now quite apparent that he guaged American reaction to such an approach far more shrewdly than did his opponents.

Dr. Silver insisted that we must state continuously and honestly that our goal was the establishment of the Jewish State, nothing more nor less. In his amazingly comprehensive political report to the ZOA in October 1944, "A Year's Advance," he exclaimed, "Don't compromise on basic Jewish rights, for the sake of: expediency, for the sake of a spurious unity! Demand what our people is historically entitled to demand, all of it; insist on it. work for it and wait!" This in a sense became the keynote of histhinking and of his conduct of Zionist affairs. As he indicated in . his address to the Congress in Basie, 1946, he believed that the essence of sound tectics is to stand firmly by a just position, to let others make proposals, not to lose one's nerve or perspective. That is why he bitterly opposed the partition offer of the Executive and unconditional participation in the London Conference of January 1947. The methods which he outlined and faithfully followed eventuated in the proclamation of independence for Israel. The methods advocated by others would have given us the Grady-Morrison plan or possibly worse.

Masterpiece of Summation

Public speeches are usually an evanascent and highly unreliable literary form in which to entrust the reputation of a leader. But of this Dr. Silver need have little fear. His speeches will prove the be durable, because most of them are actually, in whole or in part, state papers and historic documents. They suffer, of course, from the inevitable matriations

is nowhere in evidence, yet he is a master of vocabulary. The total impression is of proce flowing smoothly, uninterruptedly, like a broad, majestic river. When the occasion demands, he can rise to impassioned heights of eloquence. protest and indignation. Yet on the whole these are calm, cooly reasoned, thoroughly documented statements. Jarael Schen, deserves thought and contemplation, It concerns the problem of Hebrew within an Anglo-Sexon kibbuts:

"The question of Hebrew speech is relatively simple to solve, even though it may entail time and effort. A far more complicated issue is that of culture. Even if all the members of the group converse fluently in Hebrew about their work and other every-day mutters, they will be no nearer than before to attaining Hebrew culture; for their thinking and intellectual interests will remain American. But if that were to happen, it would defeat their purpose, which is to establish a national Jewish settlement that just happens to be composed of Americans. Language, after all, is merely a vehicle; and to speak Hebrew does not mean that the speaker feels like a Jew. any more than an English-speaking Indian feels like an Englishman, Somehow the members . . . must find the road that will lead them into the domain of Hebrew culture and that may be no easy task."

There is no better symbol of the permanence of a state than the functioning of its governmental and daily machinery to the extent that the most unusual matters become pressic events, scarcely worth more than a line of type. Nevertheless, to an outside observer, many every day details of Israeli living indicate most elearly the extraordinary A lecture on "The Spirit of Far Eastern Art" was given by Professor W. Y. Near Latrun, archaeological diggings uncovered two mease floors, built one upon the other and belonging to a Samaritan synagogue of the fourth and fifth century A. D. This is ronsidered the first archaeological discovery of modern times concerning the Samaritans and sheds new light on a cult about which little is known.

Israel Government Information Head Pledges Cooperation to ZOA House

Simultaneously with the outablishment of the ZOA House in Israel, there is also being established in the United States, under the Frisch program approved by the National Administrative Council, a ZOA Israel Information Service, which will bringfull information on every phase of life in the Jewish State to American Jews.

Two new appointees to the Israel Embassy in Washington have recently arrived from Tel Aviv, according to an announcement by the Israel Office of Information. They are Dr. Moshe Keren, Counselor, and Dr. Moshe Erwin Witkon, Economic Counselor,



to yield to the voice of authority, as is customary in other countries. Instead, all of the passengers on the bus began to take sides and the bus became a kind of town meeting. PRELIMINARY ANNOUNCE ments from the publishers indieate that a considerable number of new books of interest to the Jewish reader will be issued this fall, There still lie on the reviewer's deak, however, many interesting volumes published during the past season, which have not been given the attention they deserve. Before the deluge of new works, it might be these, which deserve more than well to call attention to some of the brief mention here given.

A most comprehensive history and review of American relations with the Holy Land is contained in Frank E. Manuel's "The Realities of American-Palestine Relations" (Public Affairs Press, \$5.00). Dr. Manuel makes free use of official State Department records and does not partment records hesitate to add his own pungent "The Ethics of Israel," by Isappraisals of American policy, especially in the latter period. The book covers infinitely more ground than a previous study by Cyrus Adler and A. M. Margalith but still leaves some gaps in the early period. There is no mention, for example, of at least two American naval expeditions which landed forces in Palestine, one in 1848 and another in 1854.

jamin III," by Mendele Mocher Seforim, (Schocken, \$1.50) which, as a classic, reads as well today as it did 60 years ago. This humorous story of a wouldbe traveller who never got very far from his little village is supposed to be a satire on what then seemed to be the utopianism of early Russian Zionists. The book is No. 18 in the priceless Schocken Library which goes right on, month after month, adding to the rich store of Jewish literature available in Eng-

rael H. Weisfeld (Bloch. \$2.75) contains not only a fine collection of excerpts and quotations from traditional Jewish sources but also the author's comments, observations and questions for discussion, which make it clear that Jewish ethics are neither archaic nor exotic. On the contrary, they constitute the basis of what we choose to call a modern way

Among the best of the picture books of the past year is "Palestine," text by Daniel Brick; photos by Anna Riwkin-Brick (World Publishing. \$3.50). The book was printed in Sweden, where it was originally published, and is a tribute to the printing and engraving arts of that country. It is unfortunate, from the point of view of timeliness, that no space is given to the birth of Israel but many readers will doubtless be attracted by the pictures of the quaint, the artistic and the beautiful aspects of the country, without respect

panorams of Jewish history as reflected in the Zionist Movement and the great fulfillment in our own day. Magnificent in conception, which seeks to place the birth of Israel in its proper relationship to all of Jewish life, the book falls short in execution, with many lapses in literary style and organization which could have been avoided with a little more care and attention. Nevertheless it is the only book, as yet, which looks at Israel from the perspective of history and without the emotionalism of the tourist or the journalist.

Continuing the scholarly standards set in the first volume. "The Jewish People-Past and Present. Vol. II" (Jewish Encyclopedia Handbooks. \$10) presents a number of brilliant studies in the fields of Jewish demography, sociology, economics, education and social philosophy. Euch of the almost 30 articles in this beautiful volume is a valuable and permanent addition to the library of knowledge of the Jewish people, though one continues to be perplexed at the peculiar lack of organization which makes this series neither an encyclopedia nor an integrated, cohesive study.

Books of general interest often contain material or sections of particular interest to the Jew. Thus, "European Ideologies," by Feliks Gross (Philosophical Library. \$12) devotes some 60 pages to Zionism and Anti - Semitiam. Perhaps some will find special significance in

"Teardrops and Dew," Lillian Resnick Ott (Exposition Press. \$2.50), is a collection of unusual poems written by an unusual woman, She ranges freely from flaming lines, written in Maccabean rage, to the tenderest of sentimenta ever voiced by a mother. Mrs. Ott is at her best when she soars into free verse, unshackled by literary conventions. She should avoid more formal poetry, in which rythm and rhyme merely serve to confine and constrict her, sometimes with awkward results. The true poet was never meant to be se confined and Mrs. Ott has the soul of a great poet.




