





EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;

- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.



Lobbyist St Kenen speaks softly and mostly unimpassionedly about his years of dedicated fighting in the halla of government for money, support and aid for

the state of Israel.

His father, a British subject who left Europe in 1881, and returned there for a visit at the time Hitler was moving in both direc-tions, across the continent. In Kenen's word his father, who thought his British citizenship would save him was "trapped there."

"In 1942; I got a post card' from him. It said, 'I'm cold. I'm hungry I have gone-blind." Kenen paused, "hat was the last word I

ever heard from him."
His father's end was coupled with Kenen's own agony of trying to get anyone to listen in the 30s and 40s when war broke out it was difficult to get people to concede Jews were even de stroyed." Both experiences were catalysts for his resolve . "to do all that we could do to rescue and rehabilitate the survivors," and then, later, to work for the survival of Israel.

Kenen, who looks like a central casting diplomat with his impeccable dark blue striped suit and salt and pepper brush of a mustache speaks softly and downplays his role on Capitol Hill.

"Direct U.S. economic grant aid to Israel today slightly exceeds \$400 million -you could say I helped get that, but that's certainly all. It's the legislators that did it."

Kenen works both sides of the aisle, gets support from both Democrats and Republicans, liberals and conservatives, politely evades discussion of which groups help the most.

"We keep Israel out of partisan politics. We go to theory I've developed is that the first year of a new President's term is always very difficult. Opposition forces try to persuade the adminis-

Although Kenen deplored the tactics of the Jewish Defense League ("any responsible person would"), he quietly attacks friends of the Arabs in this country and refers to them as the tro-diplomatic complex." It is a "coalition of oil lobbytural and theplogical incor

ests, in the Arab world."

He added "the Arab states always insist we out number and out-pressure them. The fact is there are 18 Arab, states with all their representatives here and our envoys in their states—and there is only one Israel. A stream of propaganda from them constantly assails Congress. While the Arabs exert pres sure at the U.N., we work with Congress where the truth can get through."

Kenen feels the reason is rael gets support from 42 verse factions on the Hill because American opinion on Israel is influenced by what Israel does." Conserva-tives are impressed, he said with a country that "stends up for itself a bolward against communism and fas cism." Liberal-minded legis latures "are attracted to la rael as show place of democracy.

Kenen's first involvement with Jewish affairs was in 1917 when he organized a the age of 12 a Young Judea Club in his native Toronto. Although he got a law degree at Cleveland Law School in 1940, he switched

200 U.S.Irish Seek to Join Israel's Army

Two hundred Boston Irish-Americans yesterday offered themselves to Americans for Haganah as recruits for a special brigade in Israel's Army in the Holy Land.

The dramatic message to Americans for Haganah head-quarters, 38 W. 69th St., was one of hundreds offering help from persons of all creeds.

persons of all creeds.

"Good luck to you, to your good work and the fight of the people of Israel for freedom," the Bostonians wrote. "If you want 200 good men, we're ready to help. We remember how you helped us in the fight to win Ireland's freedom."

But Americans for Haganah, whose function is only to keep the public informed of Haganah's activities, politely told its Boston friends it is not a recruiting agency.

The office has attracted a steady stream of volunteers since Friday. Yesterday, David Wahl, executive director, looked up from his desk at a handsome Irish-American youth lugging a suitcase.

"How can I get over there today to help out?" the visitor inquired.

Wahl later told newspapermen:

Gottlieb Hammer, cortroller of the Agency office here, said arrangements have been made with rangements have been made with Israel's postmaster general to deliver the mail. A rate of 25 cents a half ounce plus a 25-cent service fee per half ounce has been set until normal deliveries are established.

Mail to Israel must bear U. S. postage. One to three planes a week will carry mail and passengers to Tel Aviv.

international law in their brutal and inhuman bombing of noncombatants," and pointing out that organized labor's efforts to achieve industrial and political democracy for the people of the United States and Canada cannot be divided from the efforts to achieve and retain democracy:
Throughout the world" the convention resolved that "the foreign policy of the United States should not be based on the protection of the property or interests of large corporations, but that such foreign policy should express the desire of the American people for international peace and be based on such a program as outlined in President Roosevelt's Chicago speech in which he called for the quarantine of aggressor states.

FOR O'CONNELL BILL

This resolution recorded the convention in support of "peace act H. R. 527 introduced into Congress by Representative. Jerry. O'Connell which would amend the present neutrality act to define the aggressor,"

It declared that the A.N.G. "would help to bring about unity among all trade unions and other groups of the population in defense of democracy and labor's rights against such industrialists at Henry Ford and Tom Gradlar."

Reaffirming the A.N.s. endorsement "of the policies of the CHO for the establishment of the union unity on the basis of industrial unionism," a resolution was adopted "urging resumption of negotiations with the executive council of the A. F. of L. and the establishment of unity on the basis of these principles."

"Without freedom of honest expression our jobs may be shameful," a resolution asserts, "We want to have the privilege of telling the truth as we see it. And so the Guild continues to war against any kind of censors ship,

"But if the freedom of the press comes to mean no more than the right of a newspaper owner to print that news which pleases him and to spike important occurrences which irk him, then freedom may be a fine word which has lost its favor. And we are discussing a fact and not a theory."

In many cases publishers used the depression merely as an excuse for pay reductions ranging from 10 to 40 per cent, while dividends remained comparatively good. These pay reductions affected reporters and copy and deak sen, along with the elerical forces but did not affect the printing orest unions of compasitors, photocompavers, pressen, sterestypers, matters and the like, for it was explained that they would redict wage outs by strike action.

This argument was thought provoking to the editorial emplayers and turned their thoughts tenera unionism as a defense against inscensity. It was urged that 12 the printing trudes crafteness could do 1t so too could the editorial amplayers.

The early nucleus of the Guild in Cleveland, as pointed out hereinbefore, conducted a nation-wide survey that disclosed the everage income of a reporter after twenty years of experience was \$38 a seek; whereas minimus pay for monthalized workers on newspapers the tare unionized averaged from \$50 to \$70 a upok after four or five years of service.

The American Sewepaper Guild was formed to preserve the vecational interests of newspaper oditorial and repertorial vorters, and to improve the conditions under which they work by callective bargaining. Those principally responsible for its organisation on a mational scale are

TRIED CONVENTION*

The Third Vorvention of the Guild was fold in New York City from May 20 to 31, 1936. It was attended by approximately 36 delegates from 31 cities. On the second day of the Convention the delegates voted 54 to 5 in favor of joining the emerican rederation of Labor.

The delegates adopted certain resolutions which caused considerable dissension in ANG ranks. Seachtions were adopted on betalf of the freedom of the press and international peace and additional resolutions expressed sympathy with the Farrer-babor solitical movement and recommended that local Guild branches cooperate with farmer-labor and wother labor groups for the purpose of providing independent solitical action of labor.

The 1936 Convention adopted resolutions to the effect:

That Fascise sust be defected in Spain;

That \$3,000,000,000 be appropriated for the TPA;

That Ton Mooney and Warren Willings be liberated;

That the plan of President Housevelt to enlarge the Eugrose Court deserved support.

FOURTH CONVENTION*

The Fourth Convention of the Guili was neld in St. Louis, Missouri, June 7 to 12, 1937. It was attended by 117 delegates and alternates representing 46 local Guillas with 143 votes. The Convention adopted ten resolutions which were allegedly rullroaded through the Convention and which were subsequently placed before the entire rank-and-rile tembers on a referendum vote. The resolutions adopted by the Convention and the referendum are set out berewith as follows:

- 8 Resolution on suspension of membership for nonpayment of tues - to resolud 1,370; to uphold 3,507.

The Convention also ruled that:

It was provided, however, that this rule might be waived in certain instances with the specific permission of the International brecktive Fourd of the Guild. It was likewise Lain own that other:

Guild shop and 5-day, AO-hour track made requisites, and arbitration rigidly restricted.

FIRE SELVICES—Provided for a series of regional meetings to levelop organizational and bargaining programs. Faind the constitutional requirement that one vice-president be elected from a wire service but kept, andatory the appointment of a wire service consists including three IFF necheros.

CMSTITUTION—Adopted the revise: draft this world world chiefly on eligibility end collective burgaining.

Mr. Isaiah Leo Kenen, who, in September, 1964, was the Executive Director of the American-Israel Public Affairs Committee, 1737 H Street, Northwest, Washington, D. C., has not been the subject of an investigation by the FBI.

However, the central files of the FBI reveal that Mr. Kenen was born on March 7, 1905, at St. Stephen. New Brunswick, Canada, and was naturalized in the District Court for the Northern District of Ohio on June 8, 1934.

In January, 1952, information was received from a self-admitted former member of the Communist Party (CP) in Cleveland, Ohio, indicating that one I. L. Kenen was a member of the CP in Cleveland, Ohio, and broke with it in 1939. This informant further described I. L. Kenen at that time (1952) as being a 'pressman' for the Israeli Delegation to the United Nations. (140-24363-4)

This informant was reinterviewed in July, 1961, at which time he advised that he could not recall the first name of the I. L. Kenen about whom he furnished information in 1952, but indicated that the I. L. Kenen previously mentioned by him was no longer in the employ of the Israeli Delegation to the United Nations ()

Information reported in May, 1957, revealed that one I. L. Kenen of Washington, D. C., former secretary to the American Jewish Conference and a member of the first Israeli Delegation to the United Nations, was the Executive Director of the American Zionist Committee for Public Affairs. 

Zionists Hear : Plea for U. S. Aid to Israel

A political analyst said Friday the "Middle East is headed for catastrophe unless the United States and other Western powers move swiftly to reinforce Israel's defenses and take action necessary to condemn and deter the Soviet Union's involvement in Egypt's war of attrition."

I. L. Kenen, executive director of the American-Israel Public Affairs Committee and editor of the Near East Report, addressed the second session of the four-day American Zionist Rederation convention at the Sheraton Hotel.

"Failure to act means intensification of the war on all fronts," Kenen said, "for it encourages the Arabs — their imaginations transported as in 1967 — to believe they will finally destroy the Jewish state. In Washington, there is an agonizing reappraisal of the arms balance and the eptions before our government, but there appears to be little forward action by the Administration."

Alberto B. Choonin executive director of the Jewish Community Relations Council of Greater Philadelphia, told a concurrent meeting of the Commission on Jewish Communal Affairs that the U.S. Government should press a charge of Soviet anti-Semitism and repression of Russian Jews.

Chernin said that, although all religious groups in the Soviet Union are at the mercy of "atheistic propaganda," the Jews are in a far worse position than other groups in terms of numbers of housis of worship, educational instructions and means of producing devotions artificies.





At this meeting the board discussed ESTHER HERLITZ's cable concerning "B.R." and his participation in public relations in the United States. Fear was expressed during the discussion that B.R. might endeavor to take over the entire operation.

There was also discussion concerning the issuance of a pamphlet on the Arab question, which pamphlet would include a reference to possibilities of development of the Middle East as mentioned in paragraph four of HARRY S. TRUMAN'S State of the Nation Speech. It was agreed that MARIE SYRKIN would be consulted concerning the Arab question as well as the Jerusalem question.

VICTOR H. BERNSTEIN (Director, Public Relations, Jewish Agency for Palestine, American Section), came into the meeting to discuss the future of Palcor; i.e., whether or not to continue use of its cable service to service the press. It was stated that the Government of Israel was paying transmission charges and that the Jewish Agency had been composing it into bulletin form and distributing it to the press.

The entire meeting was devoted to the plans and policies B. R. stated that he had studied the existing organization interested in the economics of Israel and had determined that most of them lacked money and staff and that some were merely paper organizations. B.R. stated that in conversation with the Prime Minister in Israel B.R. had insisted that any program of promoting Israel economically should be undertaken on a Government level and that he, B.R. would like to establish such a program in New York, Paris, London, Rome, Buenos Aires and Rio de Janiero. B.R. estimated that the cost might run as high as \$250,000 for the first year and stated that he had asked the Government for \$75,000 and he would raise the remainder. He stated that he had asked for \$25,000 immediately from the Government and requested that it be placed in LOURIE's custody. B.R. proposed the utilization of all existing organizations. He stated that he intended to survey the economic services of the Jewish Agency's Economic Department in consultation with ROBERT AATHAN. B.R. also proposed strengthening the Israeli Offic of Information in Tel Aviv and suggested that PEARLMAN (MOSHE PEARLMAN, Director, Press and Information Division, Israeli Ministry of Foreign Affairs) submit a detailed account of his needs for the next six months as far as equipment, personnel and money were concerned.

B.R. also suggested an all-over press job concerning the economic picture only. He said that he intended to work in the economic field only and that he felt that this would help every Jewish organization concentrating on Israel; that he wanted to place a series of pieces in from eight to twelve top magazines and stated that he had already spoken to DeWITT WALLACE of Reader's Digest and would call on HERBERT MAYES of Cosmopolitan and DAVID SMART of Coronet. B.R. also proposed encouraging the wealthy to visit Israel to stimulate investment. He also proposed making funds available for important propaganda programs. B.R.

also wanted to hire a man to work for him at the Consulate in New York in order that the program emanate from the Government itself. B.R. suggested that funds made available to him be kept in a separate account and that LOURIE sign all checks.

Informant stated that ELATH aked B.R. if the global characteristics of B.R.'s work would exclude him from control by local Israeli authorities. B.R. stated that he would follow whatever way was the most practical and would get the best results; that he wanted to avoid red tape; that if in getting the job done it could be done more quickly through the Public Relations Board and economic organizations he would work with them but stated he did not wish to be hindered by anyone.

The identity of Mr. GUTMAN is unknown, however, T-6 has advised that one YAAGOV GUTMAN was in late 1948 employed at the Israeli Supply Mission in New York City as an expeditor.

T-3 stated that at this meeting of the Press Relations Board jurisdiction and function of the two offices (Washington and New York) were decided upon. Washington was to cover other Embassies, Congress, Washington Press and the National Press Club. New York Office was to cover the United Nations, Organizations (Jewish), and the press emanating from New York.

Informant stated that following the meeting a short conference was held with FEINBERG and WAHL on "Israel Speaks"; that ELATH reported to them the board's agreement to provide additional material and assistance to the paper. ELATH pointed out that the paper would be given confidential briefing but in turn the Government would expect the loyal cooperation of the paper. FEINBERG assured the board on this matter but said that the editors would feel free to conduct the paper as an independent publication and to criticize the Government (of Israel) when



PEARLMAN in answering DAFNI's request to be returned to yisit Israel to personally set out his position in a dispute in which he was opposed by ELIAHU ELATH, stated that the matter would be taken up within the next few weeks and that the foreign ministry was very jealous of its personnel and would have to decide whether at that moment members of their staff serving abroad should come to Israel for visits. As a possible solution to DAFNI's request PEARLMAN tells him that his best bet would be to make application to return to Israel through ESTHER HERLITZ, who was at that time Acting Head of the American Division of the Foreign Ministry, and PEARLMAN concludes by stating that when he gets a chance to talk to anyone else of influence he would do so and trusts that his attempts would be successful. PEARLMAN stated in conclusion that he himself had sent a note to ESTHER HERLITZ strongly recommending D.FNI's visit.

In connection with DAFNI's desire to visit Israel, T-3 stated that DAFNI departed Los Angeles for Israel on June 8, 1949 and returned to Los Angeles on July 15, 1949.

In connection with DAFNI's differences with ELATH
the information furnished by T-3 discloses that there was a
constant squabble between the three Offices of Information then
existent in the United States (New York, Washington and Los Angeles)
and that DAFNI was of the opinion that public relations work
should be decentralized and that I. L. KENEN was as resolute
that public relations work should be centralized in one office.

In connection with DAFNI's visit to Israel it is pointed out, supra, that immediately upon his return to the O/S United States he reported to the Public Relations Board in New York. It is also noted that DAFNI makes reference to a shakeup in Israel after the departure of AVRAHAM HARMON.

July 20, 1949 to KENEN reflects that RITA was probably flying the 28th. This message was not a DAAT message. It is also pointed out that at the Press Relations Board meeting in New York on July 18, 1949 RITA GROSSMAN was not in attendance and that she had attended all previous meetings.

It is pointed out that the Public Relations Board, which set policy for the Israeli Office of Information in the United States, was composed of the ranking Israeli officials in the United States, with the exception of the Military Attache and members of Israel's delegation to the United Nations. It is also noted that the majority of the DAAT messages dealt with, mainly, matters pertaining to the United Nations. I. L. KENEN was Director of Public Relations for the Israeli delegation to the United Nations and ARTHUR LOURIE was an alternate delegate.

T-3 stated that on March 1, 1950, REUVEN DAFNI advised THEODORE (MOLLEK (at that time Head of the American Desk, Israeli Foreign Office) of his thoughts concerning the future of the Israeli Office of Information in the United States. DAFNI called KOLLEK's attention to a report made by SYMENEN, which report consisted of the activities of the Israeli Office of Information and which report contained two appendices, one by RITA GROSSMAN and the other by RUTH GOLDSCHMIDT. The KENEN report also contained a confidential report on relations between

Washington and New York, and KENEN's conclusions and suggestions for a future program. DAFNI states that KOLLEK must remember when they first started talking about an Office of Information in New York, which office was to combine military as well as political information; that at the time the question of a weekly or biweekly publication was raised; that during the long weeks and months that followed this question was constantly discussed in the regular biweekly meeting of the Public Relations Board either in Washington or New York but that for reasons inherent in the personal struggle which went on between HAZY and SY nothing (U) came of it. (HAZY, according to T-3, is HARRY ZINDER.)

T-3 advised that in the main DAFNI criticised KENEN quite strongly and set out the differences which had arisen between the three offices of information. DAFNI also advised KOLLEK that he was forwarding a report of Mr. ROSENKRANS who had been helping DAFNI on matters of public relations and information while his wife, RINNA DAFNI, was confined (a child was born to the DAFNIs on November 1, 1948). DAFNI stated that ROSENKRANS was leaving his office in a few weeks but had been in Los Angeles long enough to get a good picture of what was happening and he thought that KOLLEK would be interested in having his report as well. He reminded KOLLEK that ROSENKRANS was the Foreign Editor of the Palestine Post for quite some time and was well qualified.

It is interesting to note that DAFNI and KOLLEK talked about an office of information in New York which "would (U) combine military as well as political information."

T-3 advised that he had no information concerning ROSENKRANS: report, however, T-3 advises that the following information is contained in the so-called "KENEN Report".

The KENEN Report covers the operation and activities of the Israeli Office of Information in New York for the year 1949. It is stated that this Office of Information served the public on behalf of the Israeli delegation on the United Nations and the Consulate General in New York. Functionally it is divided into two sections, the Production and Distribution Division which processes information into news releases and publishes and disseminates documents. It is under the director of Miss RITA GROSSMAN. The Research and Reference Division of the Office deals primarily with information for the general public. This division analyses clippings and files all periodicals, and is under the direction of Miss RUTH GOLDSCHMIDT.

The report contains a great many statistical accomplishments (such as documents, news releases, pamphlets, etc., published and distributed.)

The report further states that beginning September (26, 1949 the distribution of a weekly news service was begun. This service is identified as I.S.I. (Israel Service of Information) and it is sent to Anglo-Jewish newspapers, Jewish organizations and individuals. The report further states that frequent conferences were held with representatives of the Jewish agencies and the American Zionist Council to discuss public relations policies and techniques. It states that the 104 National Jewish Agencies in New York receive releases and constantly ask for news editorial advice, feature material and photographs and had cooperated in helping produce some of the more important publications by buying and distributing large quantities.

The report states that the Office of Information performs extensive service for the United Nations delegation in other than purely press ways in that members of the staff had prepared preliminary surveys on United Nations major problems. Informant stated that attached to KENEN's report was a memorandum entitled "Relations between Washington and New York" and "Proposals on Function and Juresdiction". With regard to relations between Washington and New York the memorandum states that it was prepared as a result of the visit of Foreign Minister SHARETT. T-3 advised that this section of the report was a detailed itemization of the differences which had arisen between the offices over functions and jurisdiction.

In concluding his report SHARETT makes a number of proposals and offers detailed argument to support his conclusion. His proposals (without the argument) are as follows:

- l. The Government of Israel should have one central office of information in the United States.
 - 2. The central office of information should be in New York.
- 3. The New York Office of Information must remain (U) with the U.N. delegation and the Consulate.
 - 4. The Information Office in New York must be responsible finally to the Ambassador.

- 5. The Public Relations Board should consist of major Israeli officials in this country and should be concerned with matters of policies--not implementation.
- 6. The Washington Press Attache has a major task in the nation's capitol.

Under proposal 6, KENEN set forth the following:

- a. The Washington Press Attache has a full-time assignment handling the Washington newspapers and Washington's many columnist and commentators, whose articles are syndicated throughout the country.
- b. His basis of operations is in the National Press Club, the press galleries on the hill and press rooms in Government offices. He briefs radio commentators and courts business and magazine specialists.
- c. He collects intelligence, meeting press attaches of other Embassies, publicity men of national political parties, Congress and Government officials.
- d. Washington is a city of personal contact. The Washington Office is a goodwill and intelligence outpost for the Government. It is not an office of information in the sense of production and distribution.





September 1, 1948, KENEN was listed as Director of Information for the Government of Israel's Mission to the United Nations. He previously served as Director of Information for JA at the United Nations. On signing the registration statement September 1, 1948, KENEN indicated he was assuming direction of the Israeli Government's Office of Information.

It is to be noted the Israel Office of Information filed a statement on October 12, 1948, that it was serving as an agent of the Provisional Government of Israel and representing the Israeli Ministry of Foreign Affairs at Israel. The Office of Information was created in September, 1948, for the purpose of the Israeli Office of Information to provide accurate and up-to-date information in the United States on all aspects of the State of Israel, including political, economic, cultural, social and other activities.

KENEN resided in Apartment 62A, 3900 Graystone Avenue, Bronx, New York.

He listed his travel for the past five years:
England and France for attendance at the International
Conferences for the American-Jewish Conference from October 2,
to December 7, 1945. He visited England, France, Egypt,
Palestine and Germany for the American-Jewish Conference
from June 20 to September 7, 1946. He traveled to the same
countries as a member of the Jewish Agency in liaison with
the United Nations Special Committee on Palestine from June,
1947, to August 18, 1947. He again left the United States
on August 11, 1948, for a trip to France, Israel, and other
countries in transit as a member of the Israel Mission to
the United Nations. KENEN stated that he had served as
Executive Secretary for the American-Jewish Conference from
December 1, 1943, to February 1, 1948. He also was attached
to the Jewish Agency as Director of the New York Office of
Information from April 15, 1947, to May 15, 1948.

On February 13, 1951, KENEN advised that he had resigned from the service of the Government of Israel.





On March 5, 1965, "Time" magazine, on page 31 of the issue, set out information under the caption, "Syria." Billed as the master agent was Elie Cohn, an Egyptian Jew, who stands accused -- with no fewer than 63 accomplices, including 17 women -- of spying for Israel.



Through the use of an appropriate pretext, it was ascertained that Mr. ISISSA L. ARMAN is executive director of the AMERICAN JEMISH COMPERENCE, 521 Fifth Avenue, New York City, and at the present time, is attending the peace conference in Paris, France, as a representative of the conference. IMMEN is expected to return to the United States late in September. He resides at 5900 Greystone Avenue, Riverdale, New York, with his wife BRATHICE.

The indices of the New York Field Division were negative in EMHET's name. However, the files contain voluminous information concernsing the AMERICAN JEWISH COMPERENCE, an organization formed to promote and atudy problems of post war Jewry in Europe and Palestine.


