Dear President Bush and Attorney General Mukasey:

A posthumous pardon application has been submitted for Mr. Charlie Winters for your consideration. As with Mr. Winters, my father, Hank Greenspun, was convicted of violating the Neutrality Act for his involvement in the transport of supplies to Israel during the late 1940s.

In 2000, President Bill Clinton granted a pardon to Al Schwimmer, the man who led the operation in which Mr. Winters participated. As the two major players who were convicted for doing the just and righteous thing, Mr. Schwimmer and my father represented those most responsible.

What Mr. Winters did in support of Israel's survival was an equally noble act and one worthy of the recognition that a posthumous pardon would convey.

I ask that you consider the nobility of Mr. Winters' actions and the depth of his commitment that caused him to act and I urge you, respectfully, to grant this pardon.
